We are very glad that it seems that we will be able to return to Mexico in the near future.

Shelli admitted to hospital July 16 with seizures and other symptoms.


Leptospirosis, a bacteria spread by mouse droppings and urine, causing encephalitis is suspected and is later confirmed.

Shelli is induced into a coma due to lack of oxygen to the brain.

After coming out of the coma Shelli wrote this note. It starts to say in Spanish...*Can I see*...?(the doctor guessed "my husband" before she finished) Then when Greg entered she wrote, as best she could, "*I love you*." She was still unable to speak at this time and was heavily drugged. Without a doubt, one of the most emotional moments in our lives.

Miraculously, Shelli gets into the Seizure Monitoring Unit in early October rather than the scheduled date in May 2015. They remove the large doses of drugs she is on. The large seizures are stopped but Shelli is told that she does have absence seizures and will remain on a light dosage of epilepsy medication.



Shelli is feeling really well. This is her on the summit of Prairie Mountain in Kananaskis in late October. It was a slow climb, but she did it! A huge and heartfelt "thank you" to the many of you who prayed, fasted, encouraged and helped out financially.

What was Greg up to in 2014??? Greg was leading the weekly youth ministry. They finished a series on The Way of the Master— how to effectively evangelize. Duing the spring he lead the youth through "The Stranger on the Road to Emmaus" discipleship course. In June, our new youth pastor, Victor Lopez took over this ministry.

Men's Prayer time— Every Saturday at 6:45 a.m., with a coffee pot in hand, Greg headed to the church to run the men's Bible study. A small group of dedicated men have been very faithful to come weekly to this early morning Bible study.

<u>Pastoral duties</u>— Greg has had few dull moments, he was kept busy with preaching, worship ministry, jail visits, dealing with attempted suicides. He officiated 3 weddings, and three funerals. There were new disciples baptized too! And then there is the privilege of shepherding a very needy flock of perfectly normal humans.

**AND NOW???** Greg is being a long distance pastor, he participates in leadership meetings by Skype, maintains communication and gives counsel by email, messages and phone calls. He continues to perform mission duties and will be going to Hermosillo once every month and a half or so until we return to Hermosillo in July, Lord-willing.

# House of grace- (Casa de Gracia) Children's Home – The children's home for abused and at-risk children, that we work with here, is being built brick by brick. Since July 2013, two dorm rooms, bathrooms and a large living room have been added, not to mention painting, tiling, and roofs put on. **Victor Lopez** received the Lord in 2009 after participating in the ministry of Olds Koinonia Christian School in Hermosillo.



He quickly grew in his faith and went on several short term missions teams including two to Cuba. Greg and the leadership team and the whole congregation could easily see pastoral qualities in Victor and decided to send him to Bible College. Victor graduated with honors and was the valedictorian for his class in May. Arbol de Vida hired him on as their first paid youth pastor in June (we just were able to officially install him when Greg was there in December). He is filling the roles of Youth pastor and church administrator (he is an accountant) He is already doing an amazing job!

Ministry with one of Mexico's poorest indigenous groups (The Triquis) just west of Hermosillo, continues to happen a few times a week. Alejandro Machado leads our Arbol de Vida Team, where at this time they have been focusing on literacy, construction of simple houses, and Bible teaching. We have purchased and distributed 10 MP3 players with the entire Bible in the Triqui language as well as providing for the construction of 3 houses.

#### Arbol de Vida celebrates 20 years of God's faithfulness!

A wonderful evening was had as we praised God for his faithfulness seeing how He has grown and sustained this church. 14 of those years we have been blessed to be a part of this work, along with you our supporters. A lot has happened in 14 years! We have moved from a small house church with about 11 faithful attenders to a temporary building for 5 years while we built the ministry centre which now houses the church, various ministries, dormitories for teams and has been used by other para-church organizations for leadership training, etc. We built what we use as the main sanctuary now to only be a temporary sanctuary but it is so full now that the church is in the final stages of getting plans approved and stamped in order to build a larger sanctuary on the back half of the property. In our 14 years we have seen dozens of new disciples being baptized, dozens of construction teams, summer teams and Easter teams assist us in the building of buildings and spiritual lives. We have witnessed our little church planted in the middle of a garbage dump, reach out to many with the Gospel of Jesus Christ. The garbage dump has now been cleaned up and turned into 100's of family homes! Just more lives that God can touch, change and draw to Him! The first 20 years have been amazing! We pray that the future would continue to glorify His glorious name!
